

End Credits Guidelines

How you handle your end credits is up to you; following are guidelines for what goes after your main end credits.

If you wish to thank your Professors/Lecturers,/TAs, you may do so but it is not required. We would however appreciate some mention of the workshop, e.g.:

Made at the UCLA Animation Workshop

If the film has received funding through a donor award and/or fellowship, that needs to be acknowledged. Here are some examples (check the award rules for any required text):

Made Possible by the Matt Groening Fellowship in Animation

Made Possible in part by the Matt Groening Fellowship in Animation Thanks to _____ for their generous support

Made possible by the Edie and Lew Wasserman Fellowship

It's always a good idea to make sure you have a proper copyright on the end. You can use your name, or a production company, with the year – e.g.:

© mercergirl moving pictures 2019

or

© Celia L. Mercer 2019

(do not merely use “© 2019” because you cannot copyright a year)

And finally, the School of TFT requests the following language:

Produced at the UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television

This film is a student project and does not necessarily represent the views of the University of California or the UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television

The disclaimer (the last item above) can be very small text positioned at the bottom of the screen for a few seconds, it does not have to be prominent.
